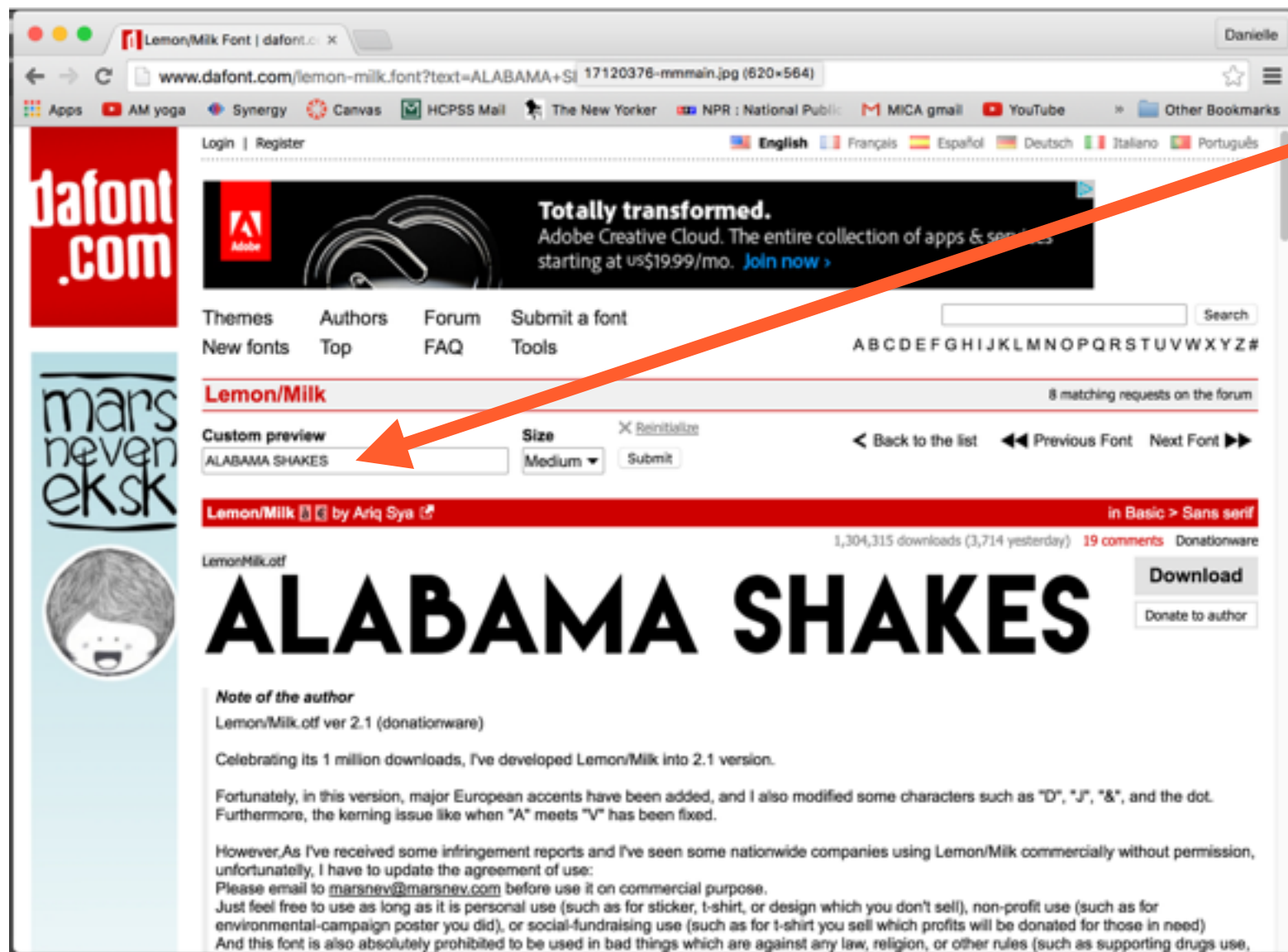
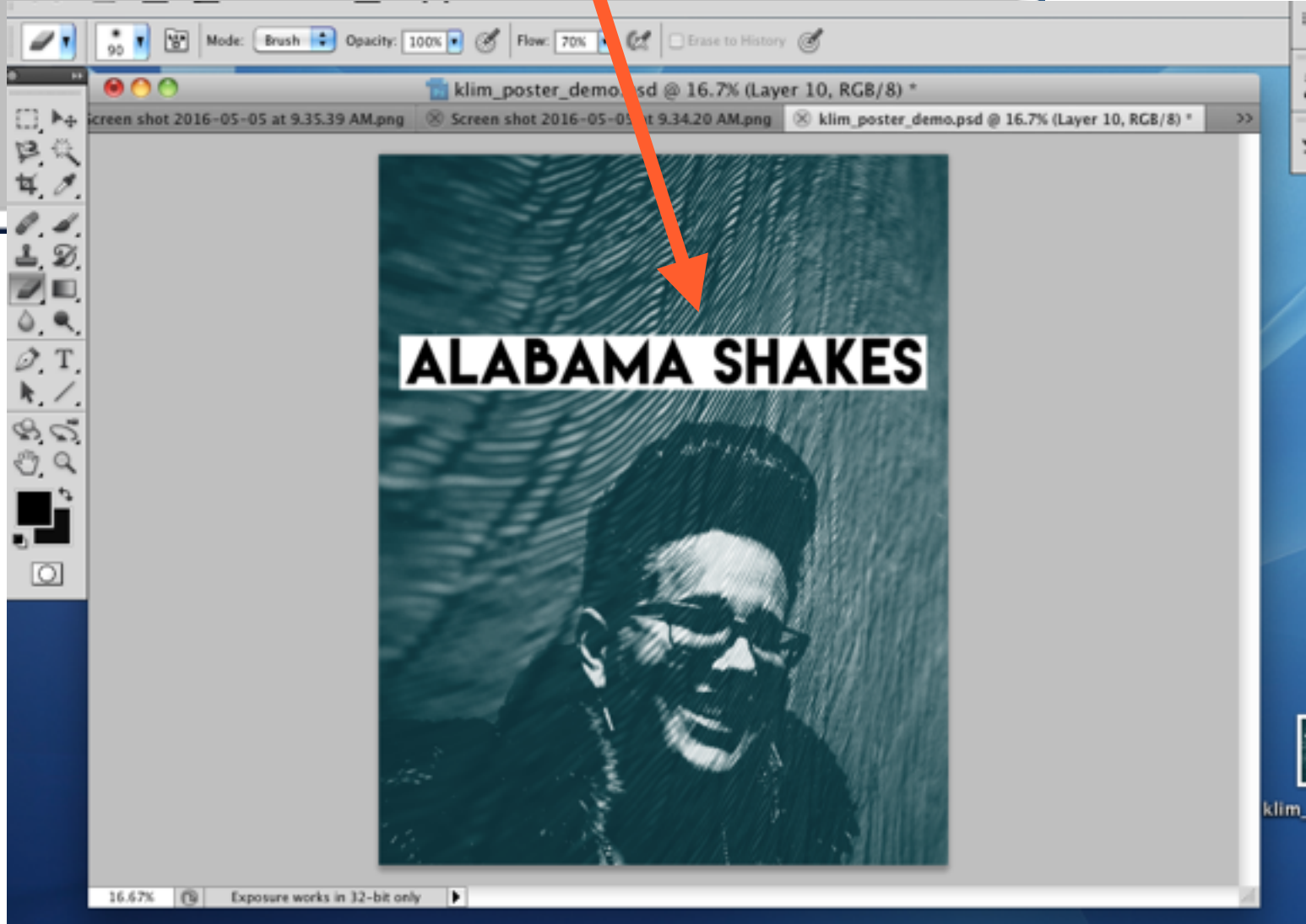
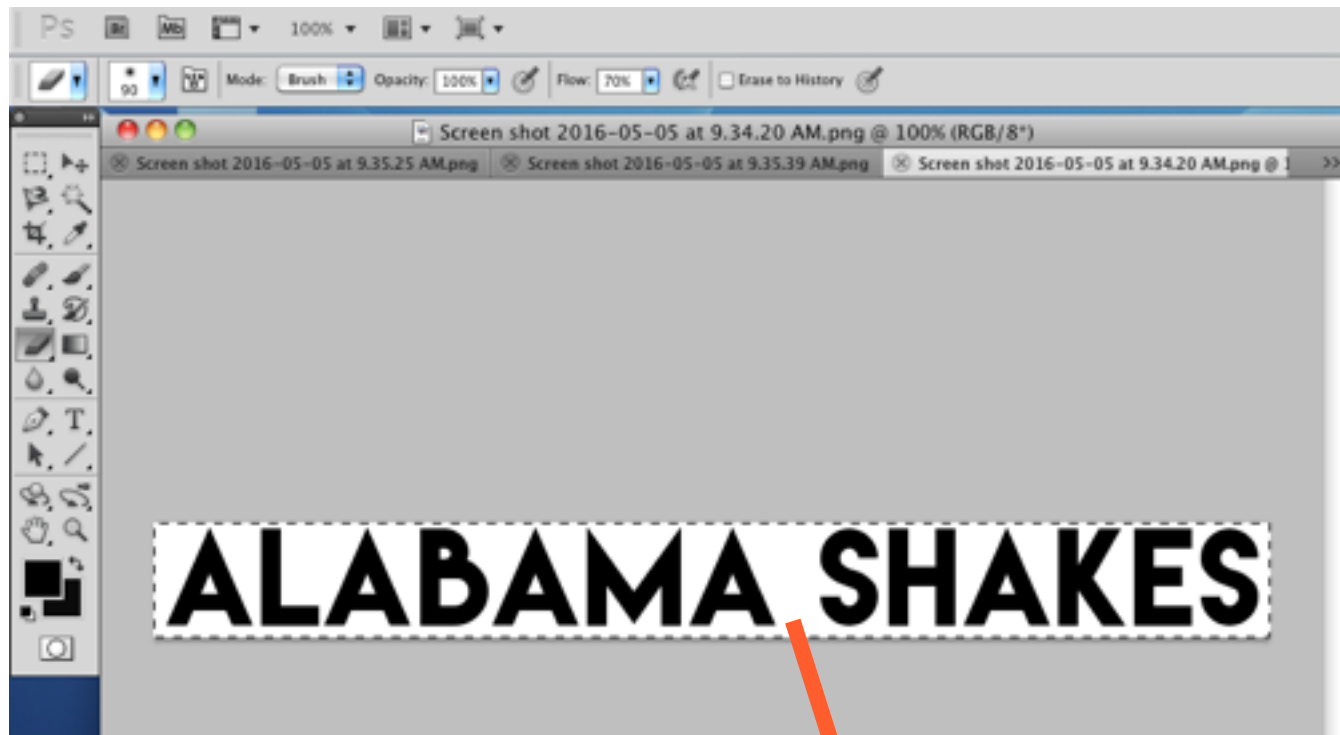


Using DaFont fonts!

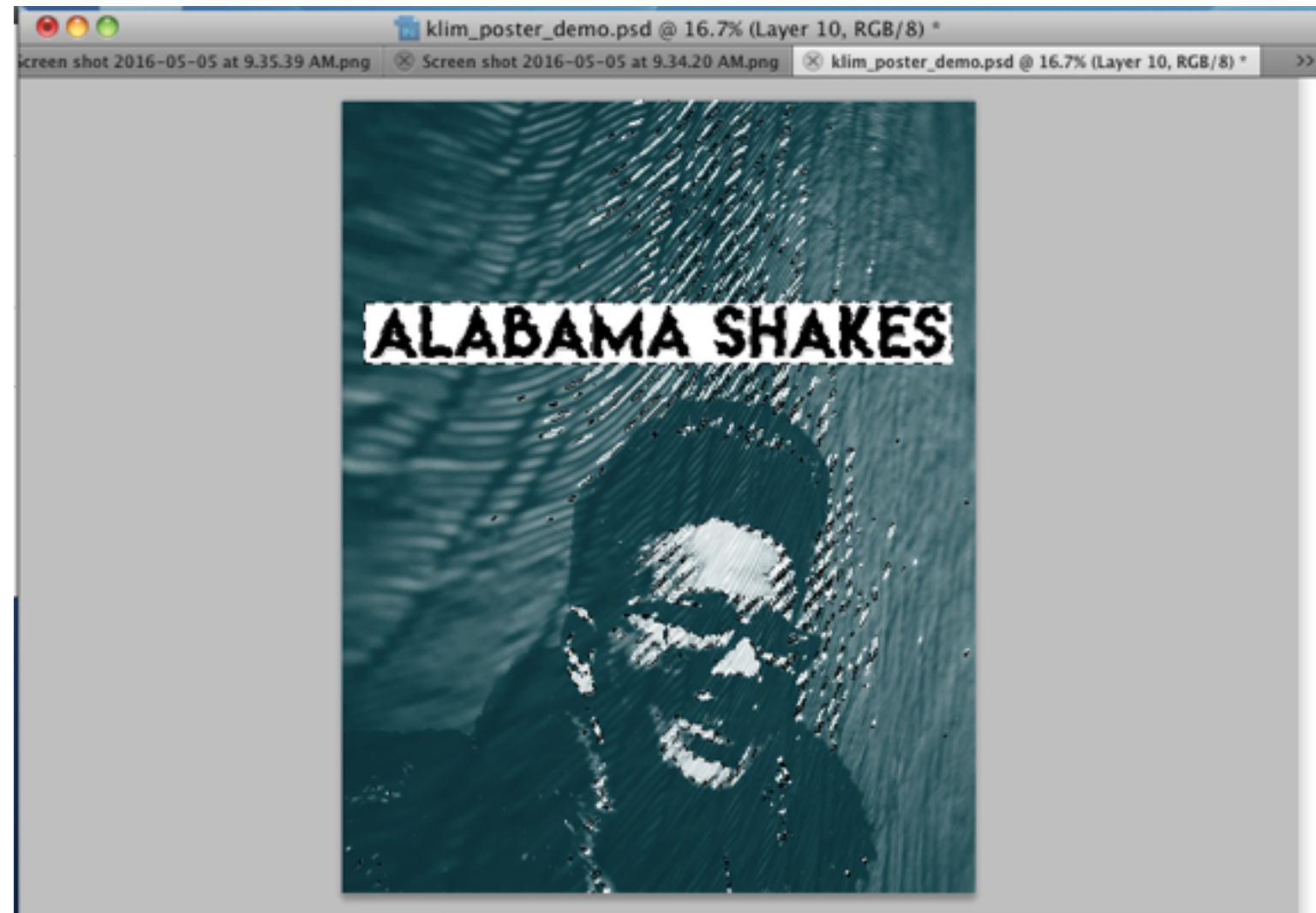
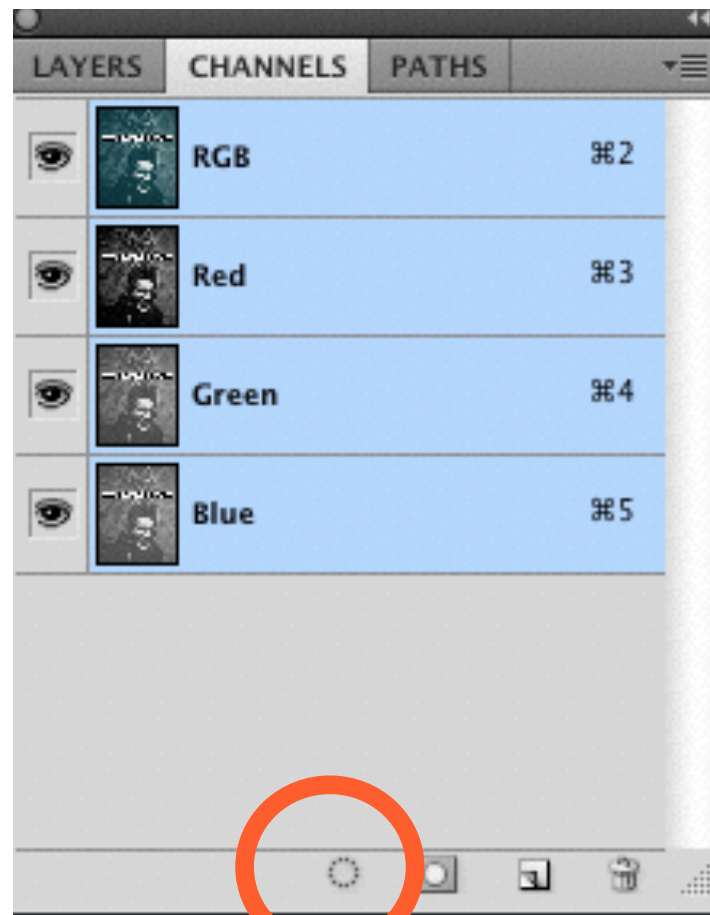


1. Go to www.dafont.com
2. Choose a font, type your text in the “Custom Preview” window
3. Select “Large” size and submit. You will find your text preview below.
4. Take a screenshot of your text:

Hold down **shift + command + 4**, then click & drag a box around your text

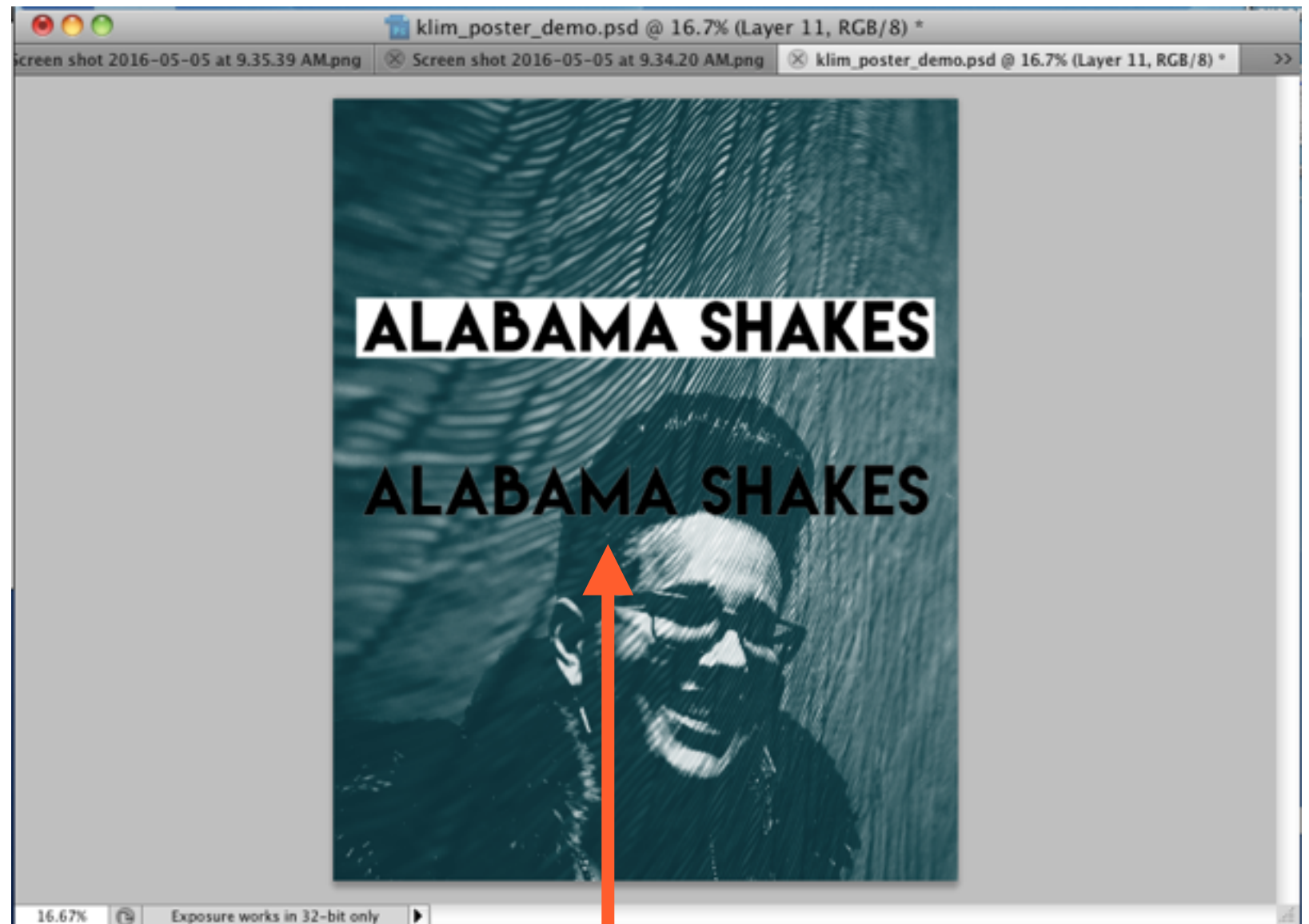
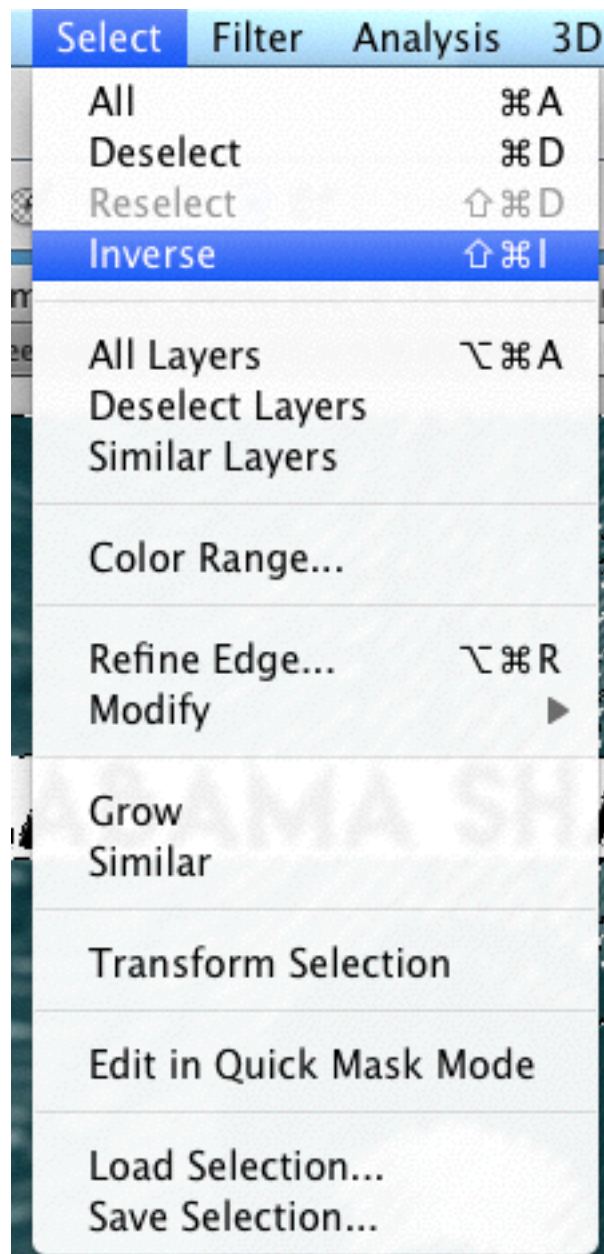


1. You will be able to find your screenshot on your Desktop. Open it in Photoshop
Copy + paste it into your Poster file.



1. Now for the slightly tricky part - getting rid of the white space around the text. Go to the **Layers window** and click on the **Channels** tab.

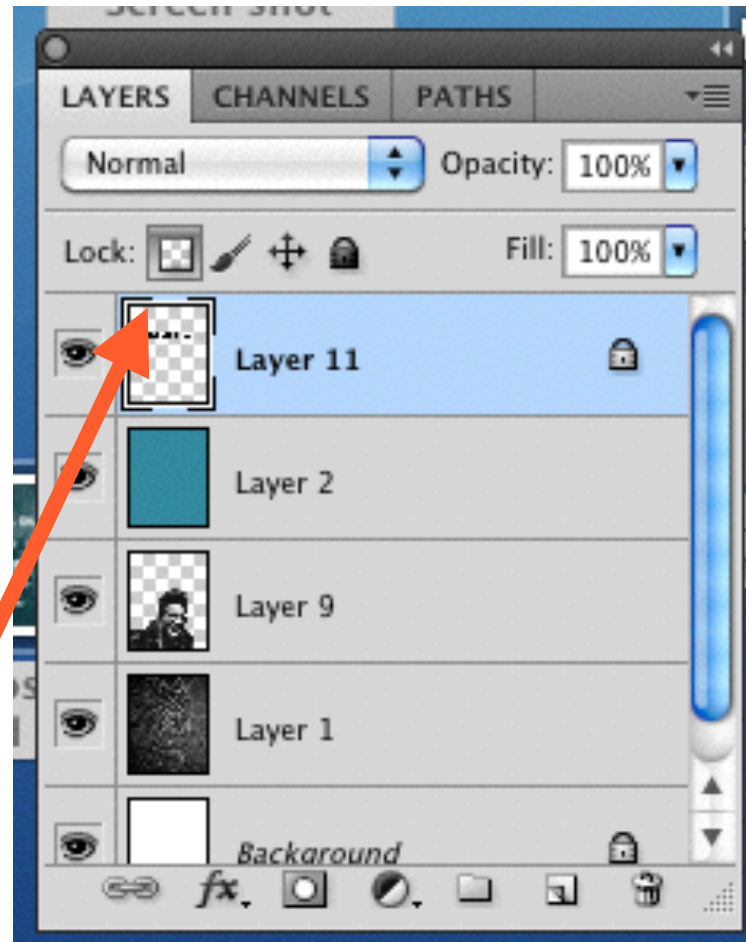
2. Then click on the **Load channel as selection** button. It will make your image look like this.



1. Almost there! Now go to **Select > Inverse**.
2. Next, **copy + paste** your newly selected layer. (*Shortcut: **Command + C, Command + V**)

3. Hooray! There's your text, without the white background. Now you can just delete the original text layer.

If you want to change the **color** of your text, go to your **layers window**, select your new text layer, and select the **lock pixels button**.



Then select a **color** and use the **paint brush** to fill in your text.
